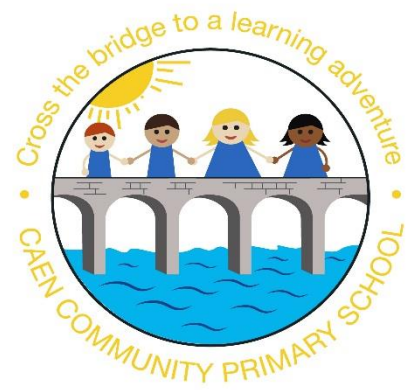


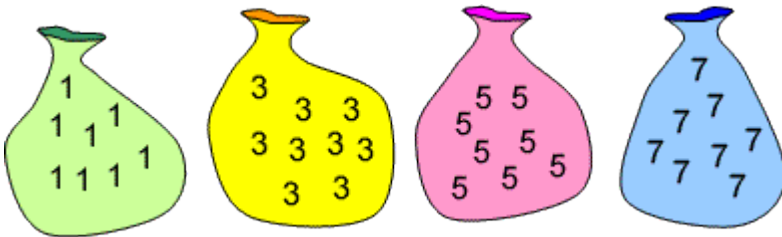

Take any ten numbers from the bag and make 37. How many different ways can you do this?



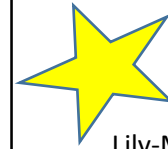
We are recruiting
